## PREVENTATIVE MEASURES

Do not store near fertilizers, foodstuffs, seed, insecticides or fungicides. Do not contaminate irrigation ditches or domestic water supplies. If this happens notify police and local authorities.

**STEPS TO BE TAKEN IN THE EVENT OF A SPILL, LEAK, OR RELEASE:** In case of spillage, absorb with inert material and dispose of in accordance with applicable regulations.

**SPECIAL ENGINEERING CONTROLS:** Local exhaust ventilation required.

## FIRST AID DATA
